2004 Sullivan Vineyards Private Reserve Chardonnay Napa Valley



Said it b4 and I'll say it again – we've got a sleeper here!! Nestled right between Duckhorn and Franciscan in the 94573 zip, the Sullivan family has been making wines in Napa since '72 – when founder Jim (a graphic designer with a Monkees album cover in his portfolio) came w/the vision to meld art with wine. Bravo! These days, Michel Rolland trained winemaker Phillippe Langner mans the helm. With this chard, he's had his way with fruit from Green Island. Note: rumor has it, they've been known to sell fruit to another famous Chard producer rhyming w/Makefred. Sold out at winery for \$30 a bottle. **C:** yellow/gold **N:** Meyer lemon, apricot **P:** grapefruit, honey, pineapple **JK: 91 \$18.99/15.19**

2004 Cavas Submarinas Cabernet Sauvignon Itata Valley



Wine stored underwater? What? Yep. Literally translated to, "Submarine Cellars", this winery actually ages bottles of Cabernet Sauvignon in a small cavern on the ocean floor for 6 months at 46°F after 9 months of barrel aging (back on land). They result? Pretty damn good! Though I'm not sure the aqua-cellarling is all the reason. Cropped at 5 tons/acre and hand harvested, this pearl was definitely made in the vineyard. **C:** deep purple/black **N:** fresh cherry, plum **P:** tobacco, pepper, leather, black cherry **JK: 88 \$10.99/8.79**

2005 Domaine Lafage El Maset Cotes du Roussillon



From one of the oldest viticultural areas of France (Roussillon vines were Roman-cultivated), comes this gem made by one of the youngest (mid-thirties) superhero winemakers on the block. Sought after for his work on the now infamous Las Rocas Garnacha (which many, many, many of you have enjoyed), Jean-Marc Lafage saves his best work for home: the schist and clay-filled 600 meter hillsides of the Roussillon. Elevation up = vine vigor up = not much, but very good, juice. Grenache, Syrah, Mourvedre, Carignan you'd expect. The Cabernet Sauvignon, you wouldn't – but will be thankful for ;) **C:** translucent ruby red/violet **N:** raspberry jam, pepper **P:** big, rich, dense; licorice, plum **JK: 91 \$12.99/10.39**

2004 Bodegas Nieto Senetiner Don Nicanor Mendoza



I love me some Argentines! Not only for some killer Malbecs, but also Bordeaux blends like this one. Made by Roberto Gonzalez (with a lil' help from consultant Alberto Antonini – of Marches de Frescobaldi and Renieri Tuscan-fame), this bottling was cropped at 7 tons/acre and aged one year in new French oak as well as 6 months in bottle before release. A blend of 33% Cabernet Sauvignon, 34% Malbec and 33% Merlot. **C:** purple/violet **N:** strawberry, prune, smoke **P:** Smooth yet defined, mocha, chocolate, cassis, toastiness, cedar. **JK: 92 \$17.99/14.39**

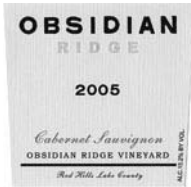

2005 Obsidian Ridge Cabernet Sauvignon Red Hills Lake County



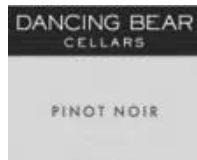
Never heard of Lake County? You will. Located North of Alexander Valley in Cali, this particular vineyard (actually an old walnut farm planted at 2600 feet above sea level) is known for its red soils shot through with black, glossy obsidian rock – ideal terrior for unearthing great Cabernet. Made by Michael Terrien (of Hanzell fame), this wine was aged 18 months in Hungarian oak – with only 3099 cases produced. *C: opaque dense black/violet N: cedar, olive P: Logan berry, mint, dark chocolate, molasses* **JK: 94 \$25.99/20.79**

2005 Castello D'alba Branco Reserva White Douro



Think: Portugal. Now, forget Lancers, Mateus, and Port. This is actually a super-cool lil' white made from indigenous grapes from the Douro (Northeast region) called Codega, Viosinho and Rabigato. Say that 3 time fast! Whites from this region are typically a bit juicy and fat in style. After cold soaking and oak fermentation, it was put through batonnage and aged in oak an additional 5 months. Best Buy and 90 points, Wine Enthusiast. *C: green/yellow N: creamy vanilla P: ripe banana, almond, creamy tangerine* **JK: 90 \$12.99/10.39**

2004 Dancing Bear Cellars Pinot Noir Sonoma County



Those of you on the hunt for a silky smooth Pinot to have with that prime cut of beef or saucy pasta dish need look no further. Sourced from quintessential Pinot Land (i.e. Sonoma), this bottling was purchased by the folks at Dancing Bear, whose corporate name was derived from the tradition of aristocracy in Medieval Europe to hire performers like Dancing Bears to amuse their court. Needless to say, the quality of this wine will leave you laughing all the way to the next bottle ;) 88 points, Wine Enthusiast. *C: translucent light pink/purple N: cola, raspberry P: fresh cherry, mushroom, brown sugar* **JK: 90 \$26.99/21.59**

Talisker 18 Year Single Malt Isle of Skye



Toffee and rich peat smoke on the nose. The alcohol bite on the palate gives way to rich sweet peat smoke, some sea notes and plenty of peppery spice. Nicely rounded and complete. Some wood, too, suggesting its age. Like chewing honeycomb and smoky bacon at the same time. Long, spicy and peaty finish. Whisky doesn't get much finer than this. Voted the world's finest single malt whisky at the World Whiskey Awards. A Harwich East favorite. **JA: 95 \$75.99 net bottle one**

Chopin Potato Vodka Poland



A single-ingredient vodka, 4 times distilled from organic potatoes grown in the Polish region of Podlasie. Seven pounds of potatoes are used to make a single bottle of Chopin. Production is made in small batches and under rigorous quality control to ensure maximum quality. If a taste sampling shows even a hint of imbalance, the whole batch is destroyed. Available in gift sets with a martini glass - a perfect holiday gift or bar addition. **JA: 90 \$31.99 net bottle one**

Cape Cod Beer – Seasonal Porter



Step into the fall and winter with this deliciously dark and malty brew with light to moderate hop character. This Porter is based on what was once the favored drink of the common man and physical laborers of East London. Perfect in the time of brisk sea breezes and cold Cape Cod nights. Also goes down smooth while watching the Patriots go 16-0. 64-oz growler only. **RS: 92 \$10.50 plus \$2.00 deposit**
